We hope you are enjoying your summer.

This past school committee meeting, an updated Acceptable Use Policy was passed. This new Acceptable Use Policy has been updated to reflect our one to one device initiative in grades 5-12 as well as new software required to support the increase in access to devices district-wide. It has been attached for reference. Please review with your child. Students will receive a paper copy of the AUP included with the back-to-school paperwork that needs to be completed, signed, and returned each year.

Please note, in grades 5-12, district devices are required for all students. Chromebooks have become an important resource that prepares our students to engage in learning opportunities consistent with post-secondary education and contemporary workplace environments.

We plan to distribute devices in the beginning of the school year and will again offer an insurance option for families. This year, we will also be providing cases for each device. In middle school, students will maintain the same device until grade 8. In high school, students will maintain the same device until graduation. At the elementary level, students will have access to devices during the school day at the discretion of classroom teachers. Though we no longer will be “simultaneously broadcasting,” Chromebooks will continue to be an important resource for our teachers and students. We hope to utilize devices in new and innovative ways to transform our learning program and effectively reach all learners.
